Exterior building cameras are critical to deter crime or capture criminals.
The Chicago Police rely on exterior cameras if crimes occur.

FMA wants cameras on all buildings. To help pay for cameras, FMA proposes using “Kinzie Corridor TIF Funds” which are local property taxes generated by local buildings.

Kinzie Corridor TIF: Fulton Market, Near Westside & East Garfield Park

Halsted St. to Kedzie Ave. and Randolph St./Lake St. to Grand Ave.

Estimated \$100 Million Balance Generated by Property Taxes

Estimated \$20 Million Annual Accrual

Approximately 3,000 Buildings

Proposed \$5,000 Maximum Matching Grants for Exterior Building Cameras

Grants Disbursed on Dollar-for-Dollar Match of Private Contributions

Typical Cost of Exterior Cameras: \$2,000 to \$10,000

Reimburses Property Owners for Energy-Efficient Lights
